# **NEW WELL / REPLACEMENT WELL PERMIT POLICY**

#### CUYAMA BASIN GROUNDWATER SUSTAINABILITY AGENCY

December 12, 2022

### **Policy Purpose**

On March 28, 2022, Governor Gavin Newsom issued Executive Order N-7-22 (Executive Order) in response to ongoing drought conditions through the State. The Executive Order requires groundwater sustainability agencies (GSAs) in medium- and high-priority basins to evaluate and determine the impacts of new and replacement wells to the basin's sustainability goals prior to county approval of well permits.

#### Who Does this Policy Apply to?

The Executive Order applies to production wells. The Executive Order *does not* apply to:

- Permits for wells that will provide less than two acre-feet of groundwater per year for individual domestic users.
- Permits for wells that will exclusively provide groundwater to public water systems or state small water systems, as defined by Health and Safety Code section 116275.
- Permits for wells in adjudicated basins identified in Water Code section 10720.8.
- Maintenance of a groundwater well.
- Alterations, replacement, or maintenance to a well pump.

## Policy for Replacement Wells & Modifications to Existing Wells

A well owner that wishes to replace or make modifications to an existing well must satisfy the following:

- The replacement well must not exceed the maximum historical capacity of the existing well.
- The replacement well must be located within a half mile of the existing well.
- The existing well must be properly abandoned following county procedures.

#### Process

- 1. The applicant will submit a **Replacement Well Form** (Form) and a \$1,200 deposit (Deposit) to CBGSA by mail at 500 Capitol Mall, Suite 2350, Sacramento, CA, 95814.
  - The purpose of the Deposit is to cover the direct costs incurred by CBGSA in connection to CBGSA's review of the submitted Form. The Deposit will not exceed \$1,200. Any unused funds will be reimbursed to the applicant.
- 2. CBGSA staff will review the submitted Form to determine if the requirements, set forth above, have been met.
  - a. If the requirements are met, CBGSA staff will sign the Form and return it to the applicant.
  - b. If the requirements are not met, CBGSA staff will communicate the reason(s) to the applicant.
- 3. If, after reviewing the Form, CBGSA staff determines the replacement well request is actually a *new well request* and the applicant disagrees, the applicant may appeal CBGSA staff's determination to the full Board.

## **Policy for Construction of New Wells**

CBGSA landowners that wish to construct a new well are required to conduct a hydrogeologic analysis that demonstrates: (i) that the proposed well would not be inconsistent with CBGSA's Groundwater Sustainability Plan (GSP); and (ii) that the proposed well would not decrease the likelihood of achieving a sustainability goal included in CBGSA's GSP.

## **Process**

- 1. The applicant will submit: (a) a **New Well Form** (Form); (b) hydrogeologic analysis documentation; and (c) a \$1,200 deposit (Deposit) to CBGSA by mail at 500 Capitol Mall, Suite 2350, Sacramento, CA, 95814.
  - The purpose of the Deposit is to cover the direct costs incurred by CBGSA in connection to CBGSA's review of the submitted Form. The Deposit will not exceed \$1,200. Any unused funds will be reimbursed to the applicant.
- 2. GSA staff will review the submitted Form and hydrogeologic analysis to determine if the requirements, set forth above, have been met.
  - a. If the requirements are met, CBGSA staff will include the Form and hydrogeologic analysis on the consent agenda for the next regularly scheduled CBGSA Board meeting for consideration by the Board.
  - b. If the requirements are not met, CBGSA staff will communicate the reason(s) to the applicant.
- 3. If the Board approves the application, the GSA will sign and return the Form to the applicant.
